Investigative Trial Counsel

The State of New Mexico Judicial Standards Commission, located in Albuquerque, is accepting applications for an Investigative Trial Counsel, an exempt (not classified), at-will, and full-time position. Salary range \$26.386/hr - \$41.228/hr, commensurate with experience. The Investigative Trial Counsel investigates and prosecutes matters before the Commission involving the removal, retirement, or discipline of judges and presents oral and written argument before the New Mexico Supreme Court.

Qualifications and Experience: Applicant must be licensed to practice law in New Mexico; be in good standing in New Mexico and all other states where law licensure held; and have no professional disciplinary history. A minimum of three (3) years of experience in the practice of law is required.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: Significant knowledge, skill, and ability in criminal or administrative prosecution are strongly preferred. Position requires thorough knowledge of New Mexico law, court rules and procedures, appellate procedure, federal law, Code of Judicial Conduct, and the Rules of Professional Conduct; strong research, writing, and communications skills; discretion, sound judgment, and adaptability to frequently changing priorities and high stress. Specialized knowledge in administrative and constitutional law is desirable. Fluency in Spanish would be an asset.

Other: Successful candidate must possess, exhibit, and maintain exemplary ethics. Hiring is dependent on successful completion of a post-offer background check.
