# PETITION TO ACCEPT STIPULATION TO PERMANENT RETIREMENT FROM JUDICIAL OFFICE IN LIEU OF FURTHER **DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS**

The Judicial Standards Commission of the State of New Mexico ("Petitioner" or "Commission"), through the undersigned counsel, hereby petitions the Supreme Court for an order approving the attached Stipulation to Permanent Retirement from Judicial Office in Lieu of Further Disciplinary Proceedings ("Stipulation"), attached hereto as Exhibit 1, in which Respondent, Hon. Philip J. Romero, consents to make his retirement from

Respondent's consent, that the Court permanently bar Respondent from judicial office, ordering that Respondent shall never again hold, become a candidate for, run for, or stand for election to any New Mexico judicial office in the future and that he shall never seek, accept appointment to, or serve *pro tempore* for any New Mexico judicial office in the future, or exercise any judicial authority in the State of New Mexico, to include officiating at weddings. In addition, the Commission requests the Court unseal the file in this matter, pursuant to Rule 27-104(B) NMRA 2011.

- 1. Petitioner invokes its jurisdiction pursuant to Petitioner's power to recommend the discipline of judges, and the Supreme Court's power to discipline judges under N.M. Const. Article VI, Section 32; the Court's power of superintending control under N.M. Const. Article VI, Section 3; and, Rule 38 of the Judicial Standards Commission's Rules.
- 2. On April 11, 2014, the Commission issued a *Notice of Preliminary Investigation* to Respondent in Inquiry Number 2014-063. (See Exhibit 2.)

- 3. On April 15, 2014, Respondent filed his response to the *Notice of Preliminary Investigation*. (See Exhibit 3.)
- 4. On June 2, 2014 the Commission issued a *Notice of Preliminary Investigation* to Respondent in a second and consolidated matter, Inquiry Numbers 2014-063 and 2014-075. (*See Exhibit 4*.)
- 5. On June 5, 2014, Respondent filed his response to the *Notice of Preliminary Investigation* in the consolidated matter. (*See Exhibit 5*.)
- 6. On August 14, 2014, the Commission issued a *Notice of Formal Proceedings* in Inquiry Numbers 2014-063 and 2014-075. (See Exhibit 6.)
- 7. On August 19, 2014, the Commission received Respondent's unverified response to the *Notice of Formal Proceedings*. (See Exhibit 7.)
- 8. On November 19, 2014, Respondent filed the *Verification* to his response to the *Notice of Formal Proceedings*. (See Exhibit 8.)
- 9. Following a vote of the Commissioners, the Commission entered into a *Stipulation to Permanent Retirement from Judicial Office in Lieu* of Further Disciplinary Proceedings ("Stipulation") with the Respondent on

January 30, 2015 (See Exhibit 1), which provides in pertinent part the following:

- Respondent agrees to permanently retire as a pro tempore judge effective at 5:00 p.m. on the same day that the Supreme Court enters an order approving the Stipulation and ordering Respondent's permanent Upon acceptance of this Stipulation by the retirement. New Mexico Supreme Court, Respondent shall effect his permanent retirement by submitting duplicate original letters of retirement addressed to the Chief Justice of the New Mexico Supreme Court and to the Director, Administrative Office of the Courts, with a copy to the Judicial Standards Commission.
- B. Upon retirement, Respondent shall never again hold, become a candidate for, run for, or stand for election to any New Mexico judicial office in the future. Respondent shall never seek, accept appointment to, or serve *pro tempore* for any New Mexico judicial office in the future. New Mexico judicial office includes the posts of judge in municipal court, probate court, magistrate court, metropolitan court, district court, Court of Appeals, and justice of the Supreme Court. Respondent shall never again hold or exercise any judicial authority in the State of New Mexico, to include officiating at weddings.
- C. Respondent admits to the following conduct:
  - (1) On or between about March 22, 2014 and April 3, 2014, Respondent publicly endorsed

candidates on Facebook while he was designated as a *pro tempore* judge;

- (2) On or about April 14, 2014, Respondent informed the Judicial Standards Commission in writing that he would no longer endorse candidates on Facebook, which statement was untrue and which Respondent knew to be untrue; and,
- (3) On or between about April 28, 2014 and May 2, 2014, while Respondent was designated as a pro tempore judge, Respondent continued to publicly endorse candidates and post their campaign materials on Facebook despite having told the Judicial Standards Commission that he would no longer do so.
- D. Respondent admits that he violated the following Code of Judicial Conduct rules: 21-101, 21-102, 21-103, 21-216(A), and 21-401(C)(2)(a) NMRA 2012.
- 10. Upon Order from this Court, the attached *Stipulation* is enforceable by the Commission before the Supreme Court.
- 11. It is in the best interest of justice and integrity of the New Mexico Judiciary that the Supreme Court grant this Petition.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests this Court issue an order granting the Commission's Petition, approving the Stipulation to

Permanent Retirement from Judicial Office in Lieu of Further Disciplinary Proceedings, and ordering that Respondent's retirement from judicial office is permanent and that he is barred from ever again holding, becoming a candidate for, running for, or standing for election to any New Mexico judicial office in the future and that he shall never seek, accept appointment to, or serve pro tempore for any New Mexico judicial office in the future, or exercise any judicial authority in the State of New Mexico, to include officiating at weddings. Petitioner also requests that the Court's order unseal all documents filed in the Supreme Court in this case pursuant to Rule 27-104(B) NMRA 2011.

# STIPULATION TO PERMANENT RETIREMENT FROM JUDICIAL OFFICE IN LIEU OF FURTHER DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

THIS MATTER is currently pending before the Judicial Standards Commission ("the Commission") pursuant to the Notice of Preliminary Investigation issued in Inquiry No. 2013-063 on April 11, 2014 (see Exhibit A); the Notice of Preliminary Investigation issued in consolidated Inquiry Nos. 2013-063 and 2014-075 on June 2, 2014 (see Exhibit B); and the Notice of Formal Proceedings issued in consolidated Inquiry Nos. 2013-063 and 2014-075 on August 14, 2014 (see Exhibit C).

This Stipulation to Permanent Retirement from Judicial Office in Lieu of Further Disciplinary Proceedings ("Stipulation") is entered into by and between the Judicial Standards Commission and Hon. Philip J. Romero ("Respondent"). Respondent is proceeding *pro se*. The parties hereby enter into the following Stipulation:

- 1. Respondent admits to the following:
- a. On or between about March 22, 2014 and April 3, 2014, Respondent publicly endorsed candidates on Facebook while he was designated as a *pro tempore* judge.
- b. On or about April 14, 2014, Respondent informed the Judicial Standards Commission in writing that he would no longer endorse candidates on Facebook, which statement was untrue and which Respondent knew to be untrue.
- c. On or between about April 28, 2014 and May 2, 2014, while Respondent was designated as a *pro tempore* judge, Respondent continued to publicly endorse



candidates and post their campaign materials on Facebook despite having told the Judicial Standards Commission that he would no longer do so.

- 2. Respondent admits that he violated the Code of Judicial Conduct Rules 21-101, 21-102, 21-103, 21-216(A), and 21-401(C)(2)(a) NMRA 2012.
- 3. Respondent agrees to permanently retire as a *pro tempore* judge effective at 5:00 p.m. on the same day that the Supreme Court enters an order approving this Stipulation and ordering Respondent's retirement. Upon acceptance of this Stipulation by the New Mexico Supreme Court, Respondent shall effect his permanent retirement by submitting duplicate original letters of retirement addressed to the Chief Justice of the New Mexico Supreme Court and to the Director, Administrative Office of the Courts, with a copy to the Judicial Standards Commission.
- 4. Upon retirement, Respondent shall never again hold, become a candidate for, run for, or stand for election to any New Mexico judicial office in the future. Respondent shall never seek, accept appointment to, or serve *pro tempore* for any New Mexico judicial office in the future. New Mexico judicial office includes the posts of judge in municipal court, probate court, magistrate court, metropolitan court, district court, Court of Appeals, and justice of the Supreme Court. Respondent shall never again hold or exercise any judicial authority in the State of New Mexico, to include officiating at weddings.
- 5. The Commission will file under seal with the New Mexico Supreme Court, pursuant to Rule 27-104(B) NMRA 2011, a *Petition to Accept Stipulation to Permanent Retirement from Judicial Office in Lieu of Further Disciplinary Proceedings* ("Petition"), attaching a copy of this Stipulation, copies of the Notices of Preliminary Investigation issued in Inquiry Nos. 2014-063 and 2014-075, a copy of the Notice of Formal Proceedings in Inquiry Nos. 2014-063 and 2014-

075, along with Respondent's responses to the above-noted pleadings, which is required by the Supreme Court.

- 6. Upon granting the Petition, pursuant to the Supreme Court Rules, the matter will be unsealed.
- 7. Upon execution of this Stipulation and acceptance by the Supreme Court, the Commission will abate the proceedings and close this consolidated matter pending against the Respondent before the Commission (Inquiry Nos. 2014-063 and 2014-075).
- 8. This Stipulation is specifically enforceable by the Commission before the Supreme Court.
- 9. Respondent acknowledges that upon execution of this Stipulation, Respondent gives up any and all motions, defenses, objections, or requests that the Respondent has made or raised, or could assert hereafter in or concerning the Judicial Standards Commission proceedings.
  - 10. This document is not enforceable unless fully executed by all parties.
- 11. The Commission and Respondent shall take all actions necessary to carry out and fulfill the terms and conditions of this Stipulation.
- 12. The Commission and Respondent will bear their own costs and expenses in this matter.
- 13. Respondent shall not make any misrepresentations to the media or in other public forums concerning these Inquiries, the facts and circumstances of Respondent's Stipulation, or the Commission's proceedings.
- 14. <u>Non-Compliance and Breach</u>. If Respondent violates any terms or provisions of this executed Stipulation, Respondent agrees that <u>all</u> facts alleged in the Notice of Formal

Proceedings issued in Inquiry Nos. 2014-063 and 2014-075, shall be deemed admitted by the Respondent, will be used against Respondent in future proceedings before the Commission and the Supreme Court, and shall constitute obstruction of Commission business and contempt.

- 15. The terms and conditions contained in this Stipulation are mutually acceptable to and agreed upon by all parties.
- 16. All parties have read and understand this Stipulation, have had the opportunity to discuss it with and be advised by legal counsel, and hereby freely and voluntarily enter into this Stipulation free of any threats, and free of any promises not contained herein.

#### RESPONDENT'S REVIEW & APPROVAL

I have read and understand this *Stipulation to Permanent Retirement from Judicial Office in Lieu of Further Disciplinary Proceedings*. I have had the opportunity to discuss this matter and my rights with a lawyer. I acknowledge that the enumerated facts and conduct, if proven, constitute willful misconduct in office, one or more violations of the New Mexico Code of Judicial Conduct, and provide sufficient basis for the New Mexico Supreme Court to impose discipline against me pursuant to Article VI, Section 32 of the New Mexico Constitution.

Such conduct violates Rules 21-101, 21-102, 21-103, 21-216(A), and 21-401(C)(2)(a) NMRA 2012, and constitutes willful misconduct in office.

Commission Rules, you shall file a written answer to this notice within twenty-one (21) days

#### **NOTICE OF FORMAL PROCEEDINGS**

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Judicial Standards Commission, pursuant to Rule 15 NMRA 2010 of the Judicial Standards Commission Rules, has instituted formal proceedings on the allegations set forth below.

#### COUNT I

On or between about March 22, 2014 and April 3, 2014, you publicly endorsed candidates on Facebook while you were designated as a *pro tempore* judge.

Such conduct violates Rules 21-101, 21-102, 21-103, 21-401(C)(2)(a) NMRA 2012, and constitutes willful misconduct in office.

#### **COUNT II**

On or about April 14, 2014, you informed the Judicial Standards Commission in writing that you would no longer endorse candidates on Facebook, which statement was untrue and which you knew to be untrue.

Such conduct violates Rules 21-101, 21-102, and 21-216(A) NMRA 2012, and constitutes willful misconduct in office.



#### **COUNT III**

On or between about April 28, 2014 and May 2, 2014, while you were designated as a *pro tempore* judge, you continued to publicly endorse candidates and post their campaign materials on Facebook despite having told the Judicial Standards Commission that you would no longer do so.

Such conduct violates Rules 21-101, 21-102, 21-103, 21-216(A), and 21-401(C)(2)(a) NMRA 2012, and constitutes willful misconduct in office.

PLEASE BE ADVISED that in accordance with Rule 16 of the Judicial Standards Commission Rules, you shall file a written answer to this notice within twenty-one (21) days of its service upon you. Your answer shall be filed with:

Your answer should be legible and your signature must be verified.

Article VI, § 32 of the New Mexico Constitution provides that all papers filed with and proceedings before the Judicial Standards Commission are confidential, except that any record filed by the Commission in the New Mexico Supreme Court continues privileged but, upon its filing, loses its confidential character, and a writing which was privileged prior to filing with the Commission or its masters does not lose its privilege by the filing.
